


THE DESERT AND NIZWA

- The heart of Oman is home to the vast sandy desert of Ash Sharqiyah Sands. Also known as «WAHIBA SANDS» after a local tribe.
- Much of Omani territory consists of RUB AL KHALI, the largest expanse of sand in the world. NIZWA, at the gateway to the desert is an enchanting city nestled at the foot of a magnificent mountainous region.



MUSCAT

Reflection of Oman of yesterday and today, the capital charms with its elegance and its idyllic setting, between sea and mountains. Among the must-sees is a visit to the magnificent SULTAN OABOOS GRAND MOSQUE and the ROYAL OPERA HOUSE, located in a grandiose building inspired by the architecture of the Omani fortresses and MUTTRAH SOUK.

WADIS AND MOUNTAINS

Highlands and peaks over 3000 meters, towns embedded between the rocky walls of the wadi, canyons and lush orchards. From JEBEL SHAMS to JEBEL AKHDAR, via the DHOFAR mountains to the south, Oman's mountains offer landscapes that are as diverse as they are extraordinary.

LAND OF FRANKINCENSE

Oman has always been one of the exporters of this resin extracted from the **BOSWELLIA** SACRA shrub. The DHOFAR region is the starting point of the famous Frankincense Route which, since Roman times, has linked the Arabian Peninsula to the Mediterranean world. Listed on the Unesco World Heritage as «land of frankincense».
